**America's One-Stop Operating System (AOSOS) Consortium  
Announces the Release of AOSOS Version 4.0**

*New Version Features Enhanced Common Measures Compliance  
and Local Management Reporting*

**Albany, NY – June, 2006** The America's One-Stop Operating System (AOSOS) Consortium announces the features to be released in version 4.0 of AOSOS, its web-based job matching, case management and reporting system used by Kentucky, Nevada, New Jersey, New York, Rhode Island and the Virgin Islands. AOSOS is an integrated, highly customizable one-stop solution that allows workforce professionals to effectively manage federal, state and local employment and workforce development programs.

Version 4.0 will deliver an enhanced look-and-feel to AOSOS Job Matching / Case Management System that is both Section 508-compliant and very user friendly. New features include:

- Searching for job seekers based on where they are counted in the Common Measures reports
- Searching for job seekers based on their WIASRD and TAPR record data
- A new interface to the O\*Net-SOC AutoCoder occupation code lookup system from ITSC
- Enhanced tracking of provider data

With version 4.0, AOSOS adds a new reporting system that enhances its delivery of Common Measures reporting. This new reporting system will enable users to create filtered versions of the federal reports, and to break out federal reports by a variety of criteria, such as by WIB or One-Stop office. It will also provide additional local management reporting options.

In addition, key architectural enhancements will improve system management and performance while significantly reducing infrastructure costs.

"New Jersey is looking forward to implementing AOSOS 4.0. The ability to search for customers based on where they were counted in the federal reports will streamline our data validation process and give us another analysis tool. The O\*Net-SOC AutoCoder interface will improve occupation code accuracy and save time. The new look-and-feel will improve productivity and looks great."
